

Fred's Chili

4-5 lbs. ground chuck

4 cans Kuners Chili tomatoes

3 cans Kuners Picante Beans or Chili Magic beans

2 cans garlic tomato paste

2 c. ketchup

1 envelope onion soup mix

$\frac{1}{4}$ c. cider vinegar

4 T. chili powder

Brown hamburger in large sauce pan. Add remaining ingredients. Simmer until you can't take it for one more second and you have to have a bowl. Good served with warm cornbread .

Potato Leek Soup

- 6 large Yukon Gold potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 2 bunches of leeks, sliced thin, whites only
- 3 T butter
- 1 large box of organic chicken broth
- 1 cup water
- 1 8 oz container sour cream
- 2 cups sharp cheddar, grated
- 1 1/2 tsp kosher salt
- 1/2 tsp pepper

Saute' leeks in butter. Boil potatoes in chicken broth and water until tender. Do not drain! Add leeks to potatoes along with salt and pepper. If you have a hand held emulsifier, use it to puree the mixture, otherwise put in a blender. Return to pot and add sour cream and cheese, simmer for 15 minutes. Serve I sometimes follow the recipe to the point before adding sour cream and cheese, you can refrigerate it at this point and add the rest and simmer before serving. Nice for making ahead.
